Attendance Policy:

Students are expected to attend all class session and to actively participate while in attendance. During the course of the semester, students are allowed three unexcused absences. A 4th unexcused absence will result in a one-letter drop in the final grade and a 5th unexcused absence will result in a two-letter drop in final grade. Should a student miss a 6th class, she/he will not credit for having taken the course

If a student needs to miss a class for reasons that are excusable (examples of excused absences include illnesses confirmed by a doctor, family emergency, college-sponsored event, or jpb interviews) that students is responsible for making up the class at time and place that is agreed upon by both student and instructor up to 3 absences can be made up.
