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Course Description

A lecture, discussion, and exercise course focusing on the competencies requisite for effective and safe response to hazardous materials incidents at the First Responder Operations level. Successful completion of the course will result in certification from the California Specialized Training Institute at the First Responder Operations level. Additionally, this course is a requirement to receive a Certificate of Completion for the I.V.C. Fire Academy Program.

Course Objectives

After completing this course, the student will be able to certify as an Operational-Level first responder per the following:

- NFPA 472 Standard for Professional Competence of Responders to Hazardous Materials Incidents, 2002 Edition.
- Operations-Level Fire Service guidelines in the *Emergency Responder Guidelines* (August 1, 2002) published by the Office for Domestic Preparedness (ODP).
- Title 19. Public Safety\Division 2. Office of Emergency Services\Chapter 2. Emergencies and Major Disasters\Subchapter 2. Hazardous Substances Emergency Response Training\\$2520. Student Certification Curriculum.
- 29 CFR 1910.120 (q) Emergency Response Program to Hazardous Substance Releases.

Additionally, after completing this course and successfully passing the Final Test, as provided by the California Specialized Training Institute (CSTI) with a score of 70% or better the participant will receive their State of California Hazardous Material First Responder Operational certification. There is an additional cost to obtain the certificate based on the current State of California processing fee. Fee amount TBA .
