COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The course will cover the techniques of handling juvenile offenders and victims, prevention and repression of delinquency, diagnosis and referral, organization of community resources, juvenile law and procedures.

EVALUATION METHODOLOGY:

- 3rd Outcome... Compare and contrast the organization and jurisdiction of local, state and federal juvenile justice system entities. Critique its differences and similarities.**
- 4th Outcome... Explain how specific laws regulate the investigation, arrest, detention, and disposition of juvenile offenders and victims. Identify how the juvenile offender is processed through the juvenile system.**
