Music 140/142 - Beginning Class Piano -Syllabus -

A. Course Content: This course structured to correlate those musical skills, techniques and understandings that are basic to comprehensive keyboard musicianship at the early level of study. With both the LH and RH the student will learn to play: 1) 5 finger patterns in major and minor keys, 2) all major and minor triads, 3) common chord progressions. The student also will learn to sight-read and transpose simple pieces there by demonstrating a rudimentary knowledge of the elements of music (i.e. pitch, duration, dynamics, tempo and expression).

B. Required Materials:

- 1. Bastien, Jane Smisor; Piano for Adults. Book 1
- 2. Ensemble Pieces Will be chosen by the instructor

C. Attendance Policy: Regular class attendance is expected and recorded. Leaving class early during lab period will constitute an absence. Poor attendance will lower student's grade. No other class sessions are required other than the two weekly meetings and the final performance exam.

D. Policy on Homework & Quizzes: There are no written assignments however, guitar performance requires 2 to 3 hours of practice in and out of class. 5 performance quizzes (play for the teacher) will be given during the semester. Makeup quizzes will not be given unless a *prior* agreement is made with the instructor.

50% = Average of all solo performance quizzes (5-total)

20% = Mid-Term Exam (written)

20%= Final Exam: <u>Piano Ensemble Concert</u> (Date: TBA - Attendance is mandatory)
