Midterm (50 pts)

Students will meet with an Academic Counselor on campus to develop a SEP. Further information regarding this assignment will be discussed in class.

Final (50 pts)

Students will have a cumulative final exam. To ensure you are well prepared please make sure to attend all class meetings, participate in class discussion, and complete all assignments.
