Music 163 (formally Music 179) – Applied Music Syllabus

A. Course Description

A course designed to provide students with a concentrated sequence of private instruction in music within a particular performing medium. One section meeting per week on campus, in addition to private instruction. as required conditions, the student must: 1. Secure a teacher approved by the College. 2. Take a minimum of one 30 minute lesson per week. 3. Meet one hour of class per week on campus for performance as scheduled and turn in weekly lesson attendance form. Maximum credit four units. (CSU,UC)

SLOs: 1) Student will acquire physical skills and dexterity on his or her declared, major instrument including voice. 2) Student will perform 6 major scales (or minor scales) from the lowest range to the highest range of their instrument/voice accurately and at a moderate tempo without a mistake. 3) Student will perform a classical composition (or song) correctly adhering to all rhythmic and pitch information.

B. Required Materials

- 1. A playable instrument
- 2. The Suggested Repertoire List will be supplied depending on the student's performance level (Freshman 1/2 or Sophomore 1/2.) The student will have to purchase the required music based on the private instructor's recommendations.
- 3. An attendance form will be given to the instructor which must be signed by the instructor as "proof-of-lesson" attendance.
- C. Attendance Policy: Regular attendance is expected and recorded. Poor attendance will lower the student's grade and, after three unexcused absences, the student will be dropped unless a good reason is given.
- **D. Grading**: The final grade is solely based on the Final Performance Exam which will be arranged and held during finals week. Both the class instructor and the private teacher will be on the performance jury. The final grade will be based on following the ratings criteria. Note: If the student took all the required lessons but fails to attend the final jury (with no acceptable reason given) a "D" will be issued for a final grade.
