Course Description

Prerequisites: The student must be able to speak and read English. Not open to students with native ability in Spanish. (See SPAN 220/Formerly SPAN 20A). For additional oral practice, concurrent enrollment in SPAN 113 (Formerly SPAN 5A) is recommended. The beginning Spanish course is based on a contrastive analysis between Spanish and English and is designed to develop in the English-speaking student rudimentary abilities in the four basic language skills: hearing, speaking, reading, and writing. The main emphasis is on the present tense of both regular and irregular verbs. The student will be familiarized with those features of Hispanic culture, which reflect the different frame of reference from which the native speaker of Spanish views the world. Additional language structures and vocabulary practice will be assigned. We will cover: Chapers Preliminar and 1 through 5 of the textbook and MySpanishLab.

- This is an Online/Hybrid course; because we will meet for the orientation on Monday, February 12, but the rest of the course is going to be online.
- All the assignments such as quizzes, MySpanishlab activities, recording assignments, Chapter tests, Escrituras are due on Sunday before 11:50 p.m. Do not wait until Sunday to complete the activities because if you have any issues with Internet or other issues, you won't be able to submit late assignments
- When you are taking a quiz or exam online, open just one browser. This is very important because if you open different browsers and accidentally close the one that has your quiz/exam, you will lose it. The system only allows you one attempt and it is timed. I have no control over this issue. You will not be able to retake the quiz/exam.

Course Format:

Modules

Go to <u>Repaso semanal</u> (weekly review) read the instructions and watch the video. In Canvas you will have the modules for each chapter that we will cover for the semester. In each module you will have different activities such as practice quizzes (Those practice quizzes/activities are not part of your final grade.), complete all the activities assigned in each the modules every week. Then, go to MySpanishlab and complete the tasks related to the modules.

Repaso:

Every chapter is divided by weeks. It's important that you complete the Module called Repaso since the material covered in these Modules are reviews of grammar in a previous week, these are components that are essential for a better understanding of material presented in this course Spanish 100. Also, complete the extra activities in MySpanishlab.

Written assignments:

You will be assigned several written (Escrituras) tasks throughout the course, at the end of every chapter. The instructor will assign the topics for these written tasks in MySpanishlab. It's important to pay attention to the grammar (including accent marks). These tasks will be assigned at the end of some of the chapters. Be careful these written activities will be grade based in their content such as style, use of the vocabulary and grammar. For these assignments, don't open them, if you are not ready to complete them since Escrituras are timed.

Voice Recording assignments:

Those activities are in MySpanishlab and most of them, you will listen, read and answer questions based on the conversations or dialogues. Some of the sections are combined with reading, listening and recording.

NOTE: be sure after recording your activity, to play it before submitting it. No late recording activities will be accepted.

Quizzes & Tests:

There are quizzes in MySpanishlab/Canvas every week and at the end of each chapter there is an exam in MySpanishlab. For the online quizzes and tests, please know that I realize that in life there are many situations that occur, such as; submitting incomplete assignments, the browser accidentally

shutting down while you are taking a quiz, being sick or having an illness or a death in the family. Taking in consideration these situations, I will drop the lowest score but be careful since I won't reset any quizzes. Also, there are exams, the midterm and final exam here in Canvas (MidtermExamPrácticaMidterm).

Midterm/Final Exam:

A study guide for the midterm and final exams will be provided the week before the exams, but also you can go over on the Modules: Gramática.... in the chapter that we already covered. Remember the midterm test and final exam are going to be here in Canvas.

Discussions:

There is a discussion every week. The first discussion starts on the third week. You will find the discussion topic at the bottom of the Modules or click on the tool Forums. Click where it says discussion, you won't see anything until you click on create thread which will take you to discussions, follow the model and after you write your discussion click submit. Do not forget that you will also have to comment on one of your classmate's comments. These discussions will be worth 10-15 points each.

If any student uses inappropriate language or is disrespectful to another student, that student will lose points and need to have a personal conversation with the instructor. Remember, this is a college class and the discussion should be academic in nature, so don't get off topic or you will also lose points.
