Course Description

An introduction to debate, with emphasis on the creation and refutation of arguments concerning current social, political, and legal issues

- 2. write and submit five properly worded debate propositions;
- 3. use logos to support their arguments during the debate process.

Course Objectives

- 2. identify fallacious argumentation;
- 3. be familiar with the most commonly debated topics (i.e., gun control, capital punishment, legalization of prostitution, animal rights, euthanasia, etc.) and the arguments that are typically made in these debates;
- 4. participate in formal classroom debates;
- 5. understand the responsibilities of the proposition vs. opposition as well as the role of each speaker on the proposition and opposition teams.
